## HASTINGS STREET AND NOOSA HEADS

One of only a handful of North-facing beaches in Australia, the calm, sheltered waters of Noosa Main Beach offer perfect learn-to-surf waves. Bordering Noosa Main Beach is the iconic Hastings Street, with its eclectic offering of chic boutiques, selling

international and local labels, and a selection of world-class restaurants, cafés, bars, hole-in-the-wall coffee nooks and gourmet ice cream shops.

### NIGHTLIGHTS

The trees that line Hastings Street are strung with twinkling fairy lights, providing a magical feel each evening – the perfect backdrop for long strolls, sunset drinks, and dreamy dinners.



## NOOSAVILLE

With the Noosa River winding through its heart, Noosaville is a laidback holiday spot with gorgeous water views, shady trees and picnic spots along a grassy foreshore.

Restaurants, boutiques and cafés overlook the river with a lazy stroll to a great range of family-friendly holiday accommodation. Jump on the Noosa Ferry or visit the industrial area for craft breweries, distilleries, local design showrooms, a chocolate factory and popular organic markets.



## NOOSA NATIONAL PARK

Consistently recognised as a top Queensland experience, Noosa National Park – one of the most visited in Australia – rewards visitors with a selection of walking trails; stunning coastal, bush and rainforest scenery; eucalypt forests that are home to local koala populations; and hidden sandy bays offering world-class surf breaks.

## THE NOOSA COASTAL WALK

One of the few National Park trails in Australia where you can follow the line of the coast all the way around the headland. This iconic 10.8km (return) coastal trail leads you to the southern end of Noosa National Park, with glorious vistas to neighbouring beaches including Sunshine Beach and Peregian Beach.



## NOOSA EVERGLADES

This pristine wilderness area is known as the 'River of Mirrors' due to its amazingly reflective, pure waters, and is one of only two everglades systems on earth. This area of pristine waterways and wetlands is a photographer's dream, a bird watcher's paradise,



and a nature lover's perfect escape, and boasts an unrivalled ecosystem that is home to over 40 per cent of Australia's bird species. All of this is just a stone's throw from the heart of Noosa, and accessible by boat or kayak.



## NOOSA JUNCTION

A hive of activity, the area has grown rapidly, spoiling visitors with funky bars, restaurants for every taste bud, bustling coffee shops, fashion boutiques, home designs, laneways with local art murals, night markets, and photo galleries. 'The J Noosa' is a venue attracting local and touring performers and film festivals.

# HINTERLAND VILLAGES

## NOOSA BIOSPHERE TRAILS

Explore one of the eight scenic hinterland trails, suitable for walking, biking, horse-riding or birdwatching – or climb a mountain for stunning views. The trail network is surrounded by charming villages, each offering something a little unique and special.

### COORAN

### BOREEN POINT AND ELANDA POINT

Boreen Point and Elanda Point are the gateway to the upper Noosa River, the Noosa Everglades and the Great Sandy National Park. Boreen Point is a small township on Queensland's largest natural saltwater lake, Lake Cootharaba, a safe place to swim, kayak, sail or fish. Have lunch at the Apollonian Hotel and keep an eye out for kangaroos and other wildlife.
